



CSS3 Pricing Tables plugin for WordPress

Introduction

This plugin enables you to integrate some awesome Pure CSS Pricing Tables into your WordPress. No Javascript is used at all and all major browsers are supported. You can apply different styles to your pricing tables, and create them all from a super friendly and visual admin interface!

Installation

- 1 - Copy the "pricing_wpresse" folder into your wordpress "wp-content/plugins/" folder using your favorite FTP program.
- 2 - Go to your WordPress "Manage Plugins" page, find the "**CSS3 Pricing Tables WPress**" in your plugins list and click on activate.
- 3 - You can then click on the settings link appearing under the plugin name to customize your plugin display. That's it for the installation !

Creating a new Pricing Table

Once you have activated the plugin, you should see a new sidebar menu appearing.



Just click on “Add a table” to display the add table form. You will need to define your table structure on that page. Most information are:

Pricing table name: Name for you to remember and differentiate on table from another. This name is not displayed inside the table.

Number of columns and lines: This basically define your table structure.

Columns width: should be a number (in pixels) which will define the width of your columns.

Caption column width: should also be a number (in pixels). Defines the width of the first column from the left (the one with the line titles).

Currency: The currency you want to use. Exemple: \$, £, etc... Just leave it empty if you don't want to use any.

Adding content to your table

Once you have defined your table structure, you will directly be brought to the page to edit your table content. It's a table that will have the same structure than your final table, containing text inputs where you can set your content.

It's the most easy and user friendly way we have come up with to create your pricing tables !

Once you have completed all your table information, just hit save and you will be brought to a much nicer table display, and where you will have the shortcode to use in any post or page, and also where you are able to choose your pricing table style.

Here is a **preview of the pricing table** of the previous screenshot. The mouse is hovering the second column.


How to display the “YES” and “NO” icons on the table

You should have noticed in the previous example the 2 icons: Green check icon and red cross icon. To display them you just need to use `{yes}` and `{no}` where you want them to appear. You can of course display a regular text.

But we have made it easy for you to use these icons instead of just a yes or no to make your tables more visual.

Managing your pricing tables

You have a way to list all your pricing tables, edit their structure, edit their content, delete the one you don't need anymore, and display a preview of any of your tables.



Please also note that **the preview page gives you access to all the styling available** to your pricing tables and the generated shortcode that you can just copy paste to get your tables public.

Everything has been designed with usability in mind, and to making it the easiest possible for you to create outstanding pricing tables!
